Simple Sentence

 Contains a subject (can be compound), verb (can be compound, and a complete thought.

Examples:

Amy and Taylor passed the test.

The dog is cute.

Tip:

A simple sentence is also called an independent clause.

Compound Sentence

- Contains 2 or more independent clauses (sentences).
- Can be joined with:
 - Comma + FANBOYS
 - Semicolon
 - Semicolon + Conjunctive
 adverb + comma (Common conjunctive adverbs = moreover, however, therefore, furthermore)

Examples:

The <u>dog</u> is cute, and the <u>cat</u> is playful.

<u>I</u> **love** my dog; therefore, <u>I</u> **play** with her all the time.

<u>I</u>love my dog; therefore, <u>I</u> play with her all the time.

Tip:

FANBOYS = For, and, nor, but, or, yet, so

Complex Sentence

- Contains an independent clause and a dependent clause.
- Dependent clauses begin with an AAAWWUBBIS word.

Examples:

Before I leave, I pet my dog's tummy.
I pet my dog's tummy before I leave.


Tip:


If the AAAWWUBBIS word is at the beginning of the sentence, a comma is needed. If the AAAWWUBBIS word is in the middle, a comma is not needed.


AAAWWUBBIS word: As, Although, After, While, When, Unless, Because, Before, If, Since.
