## Simple Sentence

- Contains a subject (can be compound), verb (can be compound, and a complete thought.


## Examples:

Amy and Taylor passed the test.

The dog is cute.

## Tip:

A simple sentence is also called an independent clause.

## Compound Sentence

- Contains 2 or more independent clauses (sentences).
- Can be joined with:
- Comma + FANBOYS
- Semicolon
- Semicolon + Conjunctive adverb + comma (Common conjunctive adverbs = moreover, however, therefore, furthermore)


## Examples:

The dog is cute, and the cat is playful. Ilove my dog; therefore, ! play with her all the time.
! love my dog; therefore, ! play with her all the time.

## Tip:

FANBOYS = For, and, nor, but, or, yet, so

## Complex Sentence

- Contains an independent clause and a dependent clause.
- Dependent clauses begin with an AAAWWUBBIS word.


## Examples:

Before I leave, ! pet my dog's tummy. I pet my dog's tummy before I leave.

## Tip:

If the AAAWWUBBIS word is at the beginning of the sentence, a comma is needed. If the AAAWWUBBIS word is in the middle, a comma is not needed.

AAAWWUBBIS word: As, Although, After, While, When, Unless, Because, Before, If, Since.
